5.1 <u>College President Report</u>

The President informed the Board that he recently attended the Colleges and Institutes Canada annual *CICan on the Hill and Student Showcase.* The event provides college/institute leaders with opportunities to engage with Members of Parliament, Senate Members and senior government officials to share perspectives on the important role of colleges and institutes in Canada. RRC Polytech students also participated in the event.

5.2 <u>SA President Report</u>
