Electrical Trades

Applicants are to clearly demonstrate how they satisfy the selection criteria in their written submissions and must identify the competition number when submitting their application.

This competition may be used to establish a 12 month eligibility list of qualified candidates for future vacancies.

DUTIES

Reporting to the Chair, Electrical Trades, the Instructor will instruct in the areas of Power Electrician, Construction Electrician, levels 1 through 4, and Related trades electrical to teach apprentices the theoretical and practical aspects of three phase systems and analysis, electronics and power electronics, control systems and automation, AC/DC theory, and the Canadian Electrical Code as they apply to the electrical industry. Specific duties will include: teaching various electrical apprenticeship courses using both face to face and on-line delivery methods; preparing all course materials including outlines, lesson plans, examinations, tests, and assignments; assessing and evaluating students according to apprenticeship standards; updating curriculum materials to reflect industry changes as required; and participating in College internal/external events and committees as required by the department.

- Significant and current industry experience in the electrical trade
- Ability to present material to diverse groups with the use of the appropriate technology
