Construction-Piping Trades

Applicants are to clearly demonstrate how they satisfy the selection criteria in their written submissions and must identify the competition number they are applying for in the subject line of the email.

DUTIES

Reporting to the Chair of the Piping Trades department, the Instructor is required to deliver both the theoretical and practical aspects of gasfitting to apprentices and pre-employment students in the gasfitter and related Piping trades programs. Topics covered will include, but are not limited to, trade safety, tools and equipment, gas piping, gas code, system design, installation, and commissioning. Duties include, but are not limited to: development and modification of curriculum, conduct student assessment and counseling, perform lab and classroom facility design and setup, maintain lab and classroom equipment and perform related administrative responsibilities as required.

- Valid Inter-Provincial Journeyman certificate Gasfitter A
- Significant related industry experience in residential, commercial and/or industrial aspects of the trade
- Experience with controls for gasfitting related equipment
- Experience using a variety of hand tools and machines

- Strong presentation skills
- Effective leadership skills
- Effective interpersonal skills
- Ability to work independently as well as in small to large group settings
- Ability to use conflict resolution techniques to facilitate positive outcomes
- Proficiency with MS Office software (Word, Excel, Outlook, PowerPoint, Teams)

- Experience building a respectful workplace culture that promotes diversity, learning and continuous improvement
