Introduction

This 2016/2017 report summarizes the findings of the surveys of 2015/2016 Red River College (RRC) graduates from regular programs and continuing education programs.

The College conducts these surveys of graduates every year to understand employment outcomes and the attitudes and feelings of graduates about their education at RRC. The findings are used across the College to improve programs.

The College's academic aim is to help create successful careers for learners and a skilled workforce for the community by providing comprehensive, inclusive, and accessible learning opportunities through high quality, leading edge, applied education programs. To assess how well the College is doing in this endeavor, it is essential to seek out our graduates and ask what they are doing.

This report contains results from two surveys:

- The first is the Graduate Satisfaction and Employment survey that gathers information on employment status and program satisfaction from graduates of mainly full-time certificate, diploma, and post diploma, and degree programs.
- The second is the School of Continuing Education (CE) Graduate survey that gathers information from graduates of CE certificate and diploma programs.

This report serves many purposes. It helps establish the College's accountability to the Council on Post-Secondary Education and the Province of Manitoba, as well as to graduates and students, and to all Manitobans. It also helps in the continuous improvement of our academic programming as results from the surveys are used for reviews throughout the College. Overall the knowledge provided by our graduates informs RRC's planning.

The report is also used by prospective students themselves, high school and college counselors, academic advisors, faculty, and many others who are involved in the career planning and decision-making process for current and prospective students.

The pages that follow include a number of tables and charts at a college-wide, school and program level providing employment related information and education satisfaction ratings. There is a wealth of information on the outcomes of our graduates.

The Graduate Satisfaction and Employment Report is a collective effort, receiving support and input from all RRC academic departments and the entire Research and Planning staff.

The primary objectives of the surveys are to:

- Ascertain the employment status of graduates, their quality of employment and whether this employment is related to their field of study;
- Examine the opinions and attitudes of graduates about the education received at Red River College; and
- Obtain information on salaries, types of positions, and locations of employment.

Report Highlights


Red River College's 2016/2017 Satisfaction and Employment survey of 2015/2016 graduates shows that graduates continue to find jobs in Manitoba and express high levels of satisfaction with their education.

Of all full-time day program graduates who responded to the survey, 92 percent were employed or furthering their education.


Of those graduates who were in the labour force, seeking employment, 94 percent found jobs. Only 6 percent were looking for work. Moreover, of the responding employed graduates who reported an employer's address, 98 percent were in Manitoba. By far, most College graduates remain in Manitoba to contribute to the province's prosperity and to its social and cultural vitality.

Eighty-one percent of employed/selfemployed graduates reported that they were working in a field related to the education and training received. In addition, 88 percent of the employed/self-employed graduates reported that they were employed full-time.

Ninety-two percent of all respondents reported that they were very satisfied or satisfied with their education at Red River College and 89 percent said they would recommend their program to others.

Graduates also reported their annual salaries. There is variation in the level of achieved income by program with an average of \$43,786, which was an increase of 0.9 percent over that reported by 2014/2015 graduates.

Survey Process

Red River College surveys its graduates on an annual basis. The survey collects data related to the graduates' employment status, salary, occupation and skill use. Graduates are asked to indicate their level of satisfaction with the education received at Red River College.

The analyzed data from the completed and returned surveys are presented in this report for each program. Data on the Employment Status of graduates are presented for each Academic School.

SCOPE OF THE SURVEY

Graduates from degree, post-graduate diploma, diploma and certificate programs, as well as from programs delivered in partnership with external agencies were sent surveys six months following the end of the previous academic year. A total of 1,556 students representing the graduating class of 2015/2016 participated in the survey. Graduates from Apprenticeship and Regional Campus programs were surveyed but are not included in this report. Graduates from the Language Training Centre and Adult Learning Centre programs were not included in the survey. Four hundred and seventy-three graduates from the School of Continuing Education programs also participated in the survey.

METHODOLOGY

The survey fielding consisted of two phases. In the first phase a survey questionnaire and personalized letter were sent to each student who graduated between July 1, 2015 and June 30, 2016 (see Appendix A and B). A second survey and letter were sent to those who did not respond to the initial request. In order to maximize the response rates for individual programs, phase 2 involved a telephone/online survey of the non-responding graduates to phase 1.

RESPONSE RATES

All program graduates were surveyed and a percentage of this population responded. The results in this report are based on those respondents. The number of graduates responding to the survey is identified in this report for each program.

Table 1 and Table 2 summarize response and cooperation rates. Response rates are calculated on the total number of mailed surveys, while cooperation rates are calculated on the number of delivered surveys.


School of Business & Applied Arts

The School of Business and Applied Arts consists of three departments: Accounting and Computer Education; Applied Commerce & Management Education; and Creative Arts. The School offers programs designed to meet the specific needs of the business, information technology, and graphics and communications professions.

Of the programs surveyed, there were 154 certificates, 532 diplomas, and 93 post-graduate diplomas awarded in 2015-16.

Seven hundred and seventy-nine graduates were surveyed with 458 responding for a 59% response rate.







Comparison of 2015-16 graduate cohort ratings with the ratings of the 2015-16 student cohort





Comparison of 2015-16 graduate cohort ratings with the ratings of the 2015-16 student cohort






Current Activity of Respondents


School of Construction & Engineering Technologies

The School of Construction & Engineering Technologies comprises four departments: Civil Engineering Technology; Construction Trades; Electrical Engineering Technology and Electrical, Math and Science. The School provides trades, technology, and apprenticeship education and occupational training to support the Manitoba economy and infrastructure at certificate, diploma, post diploma, and degree levels.

Of the programs surveyed, there were 318 certificates, 221 diplomas, 7 post-graduate diplomas, and 22 degrees awarded in 2015-16.

Five hundred and sixty-eight graduates were surveyed with 311 responding for a 55% response rate.


School of Health Sciences & Community Services

The School of Health Sciences & Community Services consists of four departments: Allied Health Sciences; Community Services; Life Sciences; and Nursing. These departments offer baccalaureate degree, post-graduate diploma, diploma and certificate programs. As well, the School is involved in a number of community-based projects and health education partnerships with external agencies.

Of the programs surveyed, there were 209 certificates, 288 diplomas, and 41 post-graduate diplomas, and 147 degrees awarded in 2015-16.

Six hundred and eighty-five graduates were surveyed with 434 responding for a 63% response rate.


School of Hospitality & Culinary Arts

This program is designed to develop the skills required for employment in entry-level baking and pastry positions within a wide variety of establishments. Students learn how to produce commercial quantities of breads, rolls, sweet dough, plain and sweet pastry, Danish and puff pastry, cookies, shortbreads, cakes and desserts.

Job opportunities have been found in large in-store bakeries and smaller bakery operations, as well as hotels, resorts and franchises.



School of Indigenous Education


The School of Indigenous Education offers a number of strategic programs and services designed to assist students from various backgrounds to be successful in all areas of the College. An important focus has been co-operative work with the Indigenous community. The School continues to improve programming and supports for Indigenous (First Nation, Métis, and Inuit) students and to improve services to Indigenous communities by partnering with organizations and agencies in providing community-based education programs.

The School includes the Indigenous Education and ACCESS Programs department, the Indigenous Student Support & Community Relations unit, and the Adult Learning Centre (Notre Dame Campus).

Of the programs surveyed, there were 54 certificates and 14 diplomas awarded in 2015-16.

School of Transportation, Aviation & Manufacturing


The School of Transportation, Aviation & Manufacturing comprises three departments: Mechanical, Manufacturing and Communications; Transportation and Heavy Apprenticeship Trades; and the RRC Stevenson Campus Aviation and Aerospace. The School provides trades and technology education and occupational training to support the Manitoba economy. The training is offered through

apprenticeship, certificate, diploma and advanced diploma programs, customized training for industry.

Of the programs surveyed, there were 257 certificates, 88 diplomas and 18 post-graduate diplomas awarded in 2015-16.

The Welding program develops the skills and knowledge required to safely and effectively perform the oxyacetylene, arc, tungsten inert gas (TIG), and metal inert gas (MIG) welding processes and related operations. Graduates receive a certificate from Red River College and a student Canadian Welding Bureau (CWB) ticket. This is a not an apprenticeship program, but may provide credit transfer opportunities towards apprenticeship.

Graduates have found employment in aircraft maintenance, in the manufacturing of farm equipment and in heavy equipment repairs. Other graduates are employed in highway construction, northern mines and hydro-electric power plants.



Centre for Teaching Excellence, Innovation & Research


This Centre provides both educational programs and comprehensive teaching and learning support services. In addition to having the provincial mandate to prepare public school teachers in the areas of Industrial/ Vocational and Business Education and to prepare College instructors through the Certificate in Adult Education (CAE), the Centre provides supports such as content expertise and research capacity through Library Services, faculty development through the CAE program and an annual series of workshops; curriculum design leadership and facilitation through the Program and Curriculum Development department; and, content production and program delivery systems

through the Learning Technologies areas. The Centre also manages the Program Innovation Fund which is used to support the continual enhancement of academic programs by funding innovative projects which are not covered by operating budgets. This report covers the achievements of the Teacher Education department, the only area within the Centre that provides academic programming.

Of the programs surveyed, there were 50 certificates and 35 diplomas awarded in 2015-16.

Eighty-five graduates were surveyed with 57 responding for a 67% response rate.


Industrial Arts/Technology Teacher Education develops the teaching and technical skills for teaching the industrial arts and technology education program in the public school system. Emphasis is placed on developing knowledge and skills in manufacturing, power and energy, graphic communications, construction, computer applications, and teaching methodology in industrial arts and technology education.

Successful completion of the five-year program results in a diploma in Industrial Arts Teacher Education from Red River College as well as a Bachelor of Arts degree and a Bachelor of Education degree from the University of Winnipeg.

Graduates of the Bachelor of Education Degree program are eligible to apply for a Professional Teaching Certificate from Manitoba Education and Training, which allows them to teach in the junior high and secondary schools in Manitoba and in other provinces.

School of Continuing Education

The School of Continuing Education delivers programs in Applied Arts & Communication; Business & Management; Community Services; Education & Foundation Studies; Health Sciences; Information Technology; and Trades, Transportation, Industrial & Environment. The primary goal of Continuing Education is to provide quality, career-related education and training in a variety of delivery options for job entry, job enhancement or career change. Seven hundred and twelve individuals were surveyed with 473 responding for a 66 percent response rate.

According to the survey of 2015-16 graduates, 62 percent of the respondents said they were working in a field related to their training. Another 4 percent were continuing their studies and 5 percent were looking for work. Of the employed and self-employed graduates, 83 percent were employed on a full-time basis. Eighty-nine percent of respondents reported that they were very satisfied or satisfied with the training they received at the College and 82 percent said that they would recommend their Continuing Education program to others.
