



High School Pre-Requisites - Faculty of Education

Future Students

In order to specialize in some disciplines at The University of Winnipeg, you need to have completed specific high school courses. Below is a list of required high school courses for the Faculty of Education.

Admission Requirements:

- Be a high school graduate with at least 30 Manitoba high school credits, or hold a Mature Status Diploma and have completed courses required for Regular Status Entry
- Have completed five credits at the Grade 12 level, designated A, S or G
- Must present standing in EITHER two credits of English 40 (A or S level) plus one credit of Mathematics 40S (Pre-Calculus, Applied or Essential/Consumer) OR one credit of English 40 (A or S level) plus Pre-Calculus Mathematics 40S

Entrance Average

The entrance average is what Admissions and the Faculty of Education use to determine who receives an offer in a given year. The entrance average is calculated using the student's best three 40S courses from the *List of Approved Grade 12 Courses* (see below), including at least one of: English 40 (A or S level, two credits), Applied Mathematics, or Pre-Calculus Mathematics.

Notes:

1. For English 40 (A or S level, two credits), Français and French immersion students may present Anglais 40S or English 40 (A or S level, one credit) PLUS Français 40S or French 40S
2. Essential/Consumer mathematics *cannot* be used in the calculation of the average
3. Related Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate courses can be used in the entrance average.

Note on Essential/Consumer Math 40S: Students who have not successfully completed either Grade 12 Applied Mathematics 40S or Pre-Calculus Mathematics 40S will **be required to take an additional non-credit mathematics course at the University (Math-0041(0) Mathematics Access I) in order to meet the math prerequisite for the mandated math course in the program (Math-2903(3) Mathematics for Early/Middle Years Teachers) OR** to take an entrance test at the University to determine if they meet the math prerequisite for MATH-2903(3) Mathematics for Early/Middle Years Teachers.
